

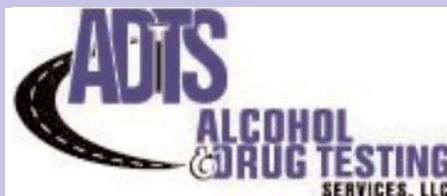

MRO & DER Interaction

This is an advanced workshop designed to be attended by the MRO, MRO assistant and DER to jointly gain a thorough understanding of their respective responsibilities and choices under the new 49 CFR Part 40 DOT regulations (and state law when applicable), and jointly adopt protocols concerning the 10 most difficult drug testing scenarios, including:

- 1) Protocol to handle the shy bladder incident;
- 2) Protocol to handle the medical marijuana claim;
- 3) Protocol on the medical specialist referral request;
- 4) Protocols for direct observation collections involving differing levels of dilute specimens;
- 5) Protocols between the MRO and DER to locate a missing donor;
- 6) Protocols on formatting and transmitting drug test results to the DER and donor;
- 7) Protocols to respond to civil and criminal subpoenas;
- 8) Split Specimen protocols to be decided between the MRO and DER;
- 9) Coordinating MRO litigation/claims expert support;
- 10) Protocols when the MRO discovers a safety threat but a negative test result.

This workshop will provide a copy of the updated Part 40 Made EZ CD Rom, suggested protocols, letters and notices and guidance from an experienced Drug Testing Attorney and Certified MRO on adoption of Protocols in each of the above scenarios.

The students will be divided into small groups. Each group will be given an audit letter and a box of files. Each group will organize their records for audit. This will involve hunting down results from the MRO, Correcting Lab records, random selection records, training records.

There will be props of LAB, MRO, HR etc. After each group is finished the class will perform a mock audit and point out any opportunities for improvement!

Each student will be able to return to their business and do a mock audit, proactively, to see how they are doing. Service agents will be able to help their clients with mock audits of programs to see where any weaknesses may be and correct prior to an official audit!

A SAPAA Training Course for TPAs and Employers
Over the past year, the US Departments of Transportation (DOT) and Health and Human Services (DHHS) have placed considerable emphasis and focus on the quality and performance of facilities and personnel who conduct urine specimen collections and alcohol tests for employers under federal rules and regulations. The DOT expects its agencies (FAA, FTA, FMCSA, etc.) as well as TPAs and regulated employers to conduct on-site audits/inspections of specimen collection and alcohol testing personnel and facilities/sites.

MONITORING & AUDITING SPECIMEN COLLECTION AND ALCOHOL TESTING SITES - CONTINUED --

This workshop/training course is intended to prepare TPAs and employers to:

- " Develop and implement strategies for monitoring and evaluating specimen collection/alcohol testing site/facility performance in conducting DOT drug and alcohol testing.
- " Conduct on-site audits and inspections of specimen collection and alcohol testing facilities and service providers.
- " Develop and utilize evaluation and measurement tools for determining a facility's compliance with DOT requirements and procedures.
- " Implement follow-up and remedial activities to improve specimen collection and alcohol testing site/personnel compliance and quality.

The course will include didactic instruction, including small group discussion and role play activities; mock specimen collections and alcohol testing; familiarization with checklists and other tools for conducting audits and inspections; site/personnel evaluation criteria; quality assurance approaches for on-going monitoring of collection/testing site performance; and follow-up actions and remedial education for sites/facilities whose performance is sub-standard.

About Austin

Henry Home & Museum, Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center (blooms most abundant in March), Texas Memorial Museum, Mount Bonnell, Zilker Botanical Gardens, the Old Bakery & Emporium, George Washington Carver Museum & Cultural Center and Austin Nature and Science Center. Free tours include the Capital, the Governor's Mansion, and many guided walking tours, and the "Dillo" ride around town.

Annual events include the Austin City Limits Music Festival, Eeyore's Birthday Party, Swamp Romp and Crawfish Festival, Spring Pecan Street Festival, Bat Fest, Victorian Christmas, and Carnival.

Golf enthusiasts will find plenty of courses to choose from, such as Bluebonnet Hill Golf Course, Blackhawk, the Clubs of Lakeway, Crystal Falls Golf Course, Falconhead, Forest Creek, and Star Ranch.

Outdoor recreation include cave exploration at Natural Bridge Caverns, Lone Star riverboat tours, river rafting, Schlitterbahn Waterpark Resort, Volente Beach, along with water fun and cruising on Lake Austin, Lake Travis, Town Lake, and Barton Springs.
